### Biographical Sketch

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Dr. Clark is a Professor of Psychology and Collegiate Fellow at the University of Iowa. Since the mid-1980's, her research has focused broadly on developing and validating a trait-dimensional approach to the assessment of personality disorder, and specifically on the Schedule for Nonadaptive and Adaptive Personality (SNAP), a test she developed to assess personality traits across the normal-abnormal spectrum. Validation approaches have included establishing the psychometric properties and test and non-test correlates of the SNAP scales including, for example, diagnostic interview scores, daily behaviors, informant ratings, and relations with Axis I disorders, particularly depression and anxiety disorders. She has published over 100 articles, books, and chapters, and is one of ISI's "HighlyCited" researchers. Dr. Clark is or has been an editorial board member for the Journal of Abnormal Psychology, Journal of Personality Disorders, Psychological Assessment, Journal of Research in Personality, and Journal of Personality Assessment. From 2007-2009, she served in the Presidential sequence for the Society for a Science of Clinical Psychology.

Dr. Clark received her bachelor's and master's degree from Cornell University in psycholinguistics and East Asian studies, respectively, and her Ph.D. in Clinical Psychology from the University of Minnesota. She completed an internship at the University of Washington, and a postdoctoral fellowship at Washington University, Department of Psychiatry. She began her faculty career at Southern Methodist University in Dallas, TX, and has been at the University of Iowa since 1993, serving for 7 years as Associate Provost for Faculty.
